COUNTERING NIPAH VIRUS

India to procure 20 more doses of antibody: ICMR

PRESS TRUST OF INDIA New Delhi, 15 September

India will procure from Australia 20 more doses of monoclonal antibody for the treatment of Nipah virus infection, Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) Director General Rajiv Bahl said on Friday.

Kerala has reported two deaths while the number of active cases has increased to four. The state government has decided to test everyone who is on the high-risk contact list of the infected people.

Bahl asserted all efforts were on to contain the spread of the virus in Kerala. All patients are contact of an index patient, he said.

No one had so far been administered the antibody in India, he said. "We got some doses of monoclonal antibody from Australia in 2018. Currently the doses are available for only 10 patients," he said.

"Twenty more doses are being procured. But the medicine needs to be given during the early stage of the infection," he said, adding it can only be given as compassionate use medicine.

In Kerala, a 39-year-old man tested positive for the virus, which was transmitted to him through direct contact with an infected person who died on August 30, State Health Minister Veena George said on Friday.

Bahl said mortality among the infected was very high in India (between 40 and 70 per cent compared to the mortality in Kerala, which was 2-3 per cent).

On why cases keep surfacing in Kerala, Bahl said: "We do not know. In 2018, we found the outbreak in Kerala was related

to bats. We are not sure how the infection passed from bats to humans. The link couldn't be established. Again we are trying to find out this time. It always happens in the rainy season." He said monoclonal antibody had been given to 14 patients infected with Nipah virus outside India and all of them have survived.

"Only Phase I trial to establish the safety of the medicine has been done outside. Efficacy trials have not been done. It can only be given as compassionate use medicine," he said.

Globally, monoclonal antibody has been

given to 14 patients infected with Nipah virus outside India and all of them have survived.

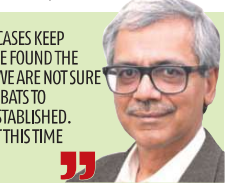
The decision to use the antibody, however, has to be of the Kerala government's, besides that of doctors and also families of patients.

Karnataka government issues guidelines

Following the Nipah outbreak in Kerala, the Karnataka government has issued guidelines to avoid unnecessary travel to the affected area in the neighbouring state and intensified fever surveillance in the bordering districts. Training of health staff and keeping beds ready at district hospitals for quarantining the suspected cases are among the suggested measures.

"In view of reporting of four confirmed Nipah cases with two deaths in Kozhikode district of Kerala state, the surveillance activities in the districts bordering Kerala need to be intensified to prevent the transmission of the infection," the Commissionerate of Health and Family Welfare and Ayush services said in a circular dated on September 14.

State expanding green hydrogen capacity

The Uttar Pradesh government plans to meet its green hydrogen production capacity of nearly half 500,000 tonnes per annum by 2028. This move would help the state expand its clean and renewable energy portfolio.

The government is drafting its maiden Green Hydrogen Policy 2023 to ensure complete utilisation of domestic green hydrogen production. The sector is expected to create job opportunities for over 60,000 people.

The state will set up two centres of excellence dedicated to green hydrogen research under the UP New and Renewable Energy Development Agency.

The current hydrogen demand in UP is approximately 900,000 tonnes per annum, especially in the fertiliser and refinery sectors. At the UP Global Investors

Summit 2023, the state received renewable energy investment proposals, including green hydrogen of over 2.20 trillion on 20 firms. The state would also plan on increasing hydrogen blending in regions where there is consumption of green hydrogen. The proposed plan would pave the way for setting up carbon dioxide recovery units.

Since water plays a vital role in the production of green hydrogen, the state will leverage the demand from the rivers. "UP has taken rapid steps towards adopting non-conventional energy options...to encourage clean energy in view of global warming and climate change, the CM has asked for preparing a comprehensive green hydrogen policy," a senior government official said.

Recently, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath had asked officials to consult stakeholders in the green hydrogen and renewable energy landscape before finalising the draft.

RAJASTHAN

Energy infra to get a boost

With an aim to provide quality electricity to its consumers, the Rajasthan government has decided to strengthen the energy infrastructure in the state.

"The first step being taken in this regard is the replacement of faulty and burnt transformers," an energy department official said. He said the supply of transformers has improved after talks with Rajasthan Transformer Manufacturers' Association representatives recently. "Faulty and burnt transformers are being replaced on a priority basis."

The association, he said, has supplied over 2,650 single-phase and three-phase transformers in the last one week to power distribution companies. "Over 100,000 burnt and faulty transformers have been replaced between April 2023 and September 10, 2023. This itself is a record."

He said the rate of transformers getting burnt increased in the last few months due to an increase in load pressure by consumers. Power distribution companies (discoms) have appealed to electricity consumers to control their power consumption.

Discoms are trying to streamline supply of electricity to agricultural and domestic consumers of the state. For over a month, the state has been witnessing erratic and unsheduled power cuts in some of the industrial regions, municipalities, district headquarters and rural areas, mainly during the night.

Farmers bet on medicinal crops to increase income

Ram Singh Parmar who cultivates Ashwagandha in Indore, has earned up to ₹2 lakh from one bigha of crop that cost him approximately ₹40,000, thanks to Madhya Pradesh government's Devaranya scheme.

Farmers in the state are turning to the cultivation of medicinal plants that they consider a lucrative cash crop. The scheme, being implemented by the AYUSH department,

involves the collection of forest produce with small organisations. The department also plans to establish a platform for the sale of medicinal plants in the tribal areas to create job opportunities in the tribal areas.

Chief Minister Shriyati Singh Chouhan has emphasised the need to change the crop production pattern to reduce losses and make agriculture more profitable. Prateek Hajela, principal secretary of AYUSH, said cultivation of 52 medicinal crops had been included in the rural job scheme.
