## CPM likely to suspend Ajanta for 3 months

THE CPI(M) is likely to suspend the daughter of the late Anil Biswas, its former state general secretary and Politburo member, for three months for writing a series of articles in the Trinamool Congress' (TMC) mouthpiece *Jago Bangla* in the past few weeks.

Despite Ajanta Biswas' apology in her reply to a show-cause notice and promise to not repeat her actions, the party's teachers' union was not satisfied and proposed to the state committee that she be suspended, sources said on Tuesday. The proposal has been sent to the party's Calcutta district committee. Sources at the state

CPI(M) headquarters at Alimuddin Street, said the party would take the final decision on August 21.

Sources in the party said Ajanta, who teaches history at Rabindra Bharati University and is a card-carrying member of the CPI(M), was initially steadfast in her position that she had done nothing wrong. But, she made a U-turn on Friday and sent a letter to the party, saying she was sorry if anyone was saddened by

the episode. After the first in the series of articles appeared last month, sources in the Left party had said that the matter was discussed at the state committee meeting. Another veteran CPI(M) leader criticised Ajanta and said that Anil Biswas "would not have spared her" had he been alive.

The series, titled "*Bongo Rajniti Narishakti* [Women power in Bengal politics]", discussed the contributions of women politicians in West Bengal from the pre-Independence era till the present times. The series began with an article on freedom fighter Basanti Devi. It concluded with one on TMC chairperson Mamata Banerjee, whose desire to become the chief minister was once mocked by Anil Biswas.

## Stopped for traffic violation, man posing as ASI arrested

A PERSON, who went around posing as an assistant sub-inspector of Kolkata Police, was arrested after he was caught violating a traffic rule on Tuesday.

According to the police, around 1 pm on Tuesday traffic sergeant Partha Sarathi Dutta of Regent Park Traffic Guard stopped a biker, who was with a pillion rider, for riding without a helmet. He was identified as Rajib Chakraborty, a resident of Raimohan Banerjee Road, Baranagar in the North 24 Parganas.

"The rider identified himself as an assistant sub-inspector of Kolkata Police. The sergeant on duty grew suspicious and asked for his identity card. He produced an identity card issued by DG, South, Lalbazar, which later turned out to be fake. He was brought to the Regent Park Police station and arrested," a senior police officer said.

A case was registered at Regent Park police station under sections 419 (cheating by personation), 467 (forgery of valuable security), 468 (purpose of cheating) and 471 (using forged documents as genuine) of the IPC.

Police said the on-duty sergeant asked the accused to pay a fine for riding without a helmet. The imposter refused and started arguing with the traffic officer, instead, claiming to be a police officer.

The imposter said he was an ASI at the Ballygunge office of the "Intelligence Branch of Kolkata Police".

The sergeant asked him to produce his identity card and reported the incident to Inspector Ashish Kumar Roy, OC, Regent Park Traffic Guard.

"There is no such thing as an Intelligence Branch of the Kolkata Police. Also, a policeman doesn't hold an additional licence to ride a motorcycle without a helmet. Had he been a genuine police officer, he would have demonstrated a better sense of responsibility," a senior police officer said.

In the recent past, more than ten people with fake identities of government officials have been nabbed from several parts of the state.

## Indore man held on fraud charges

**Kolkata:** The Kolkata Police's cyber police station on Tuesday arrested a man from his home in Indore in Madhya Pradesh for allegedly duping a Kolkata resident using a fake WhatsApp account. The police identified the accused as 27-year-old Jayesh Patidar. The accused allegedly used the photo of the victim's family friend as his WhatsApp profile picture and took Rs 6 lakh from him, claiming that it was for a relative's medical treatment. The matter came to light when the complainant met the person whose identity the accused allegedly stole, and enquired about the health of his relative. **ENS**

## Football game leads to clash, one injured in firing: Kolkata Police

A 41-YEAR-OLD man was injured in an alleged firing incident at Park Street on Monday night, police said on Tuesday. The alleged

incident occurred as two groups clashed after a football match to mark 'Khela Hobe Diwas' earlier in the day, they added.

Police identified three suspects in connection with the incident as Sohail Khan alias Shahbaz, Sahnawaz Sagar alias

Nawab and Md Sharekh. All three are residents of Elliot Lane of Park Street. The injured person, Lawrence D'Cruze, is now out of danger, police said.

"The accused were involved in a skirmish with the victim (injured person), the complainant

and other local residents over the result of a football match around 10:30 am on Monday," said a police officer.

According to the police, around 12:30 am on Tuesday, a group of persons opened fire on another group of local residents,

resulting in a leg injury to D'Cruze.

An empty cartridge, a live cartridge have been recovered from spot. Although the accused persons fled, three of them were arrested subsequently on the basis of eyewitness statements. A probe is on, police said.
